

Right to Information - Disclosures

1 Purpose

Section 23 of the *Right to Information Act 2010* (RTI Act) states that a public authority must as soon as practicable after the end of each financial year provide details on information published as required and routine disclosures as well as information relating to the applications for assessed disclosure that have been received. This document was created to fulfil this requirement, it is reviewed annually and uploaded to the Motor Accidents and Insurance Board Website.

Right to Information – Disclosures

Release of Information for the 2020-21 year

- Organisational Overview;
- Personal Information Protection Policy;
- Personal Information Protection Statement;

- *Motor Accidents (Liabilities & Compensation) Act 1973*; and
- *Motor Accidents (Liabilities & Compensation) Regulations 2010*.
